The Black Book Interactive Project: Extending the Reach (BBIP-ER) is a research initiative bridging the gap within the digital humanities. Over the next 18 months, we will expand our digital archive – currently 1250 African American novels – by adding content and completing the conversion to machine readable files with descriptive metadata. Our goal is to expand the user network through training webinars, making the BBIP-ER database a dedicated interactive environment for scholars, librarians, and practitioners who become working partners in new research opportunities.
