The Black Book Interactive Project: Extending the Reach (BBIP-ER) is a research initiative bridging the gap within the digital humanities. Our digital archive – which currently boasts nearly 1600 African American Novels – is constantly being updated with newly identified texts. With the help of ACLS, we are adding fresh content and completing the conversion to machine readable files with descriptive metadata. We expand the user network through online and in-person training, making the BBIP-ER database a dedicated interactive environment for scholars, librarians and practitioners who become working partners in new research opportunities.

BBIP-ER Scholar Program II

The BBIP-ER Scholar Program II is a series of intensive workshops (both online and in person) to make BBIP-ER available to a larger group of scholars, educators, and students currently outside the digital community. Over the course of 2020, BBIP-ER Scholars will produce Digital Humanities research projects utilizing the BBIP-ER corpus and interface. 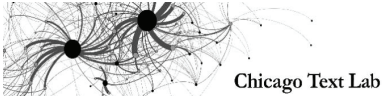
