Join the John B. Coleman Library in a discussion with the editors of the *Third Edition to The Handbook of Black Librarianship* published by Rowman & Littlefield. The First Edition was edited by Dr. E.J. Josey and Ann Allen Shockley in 1977. The Second Edition by Dr. Josey and Marva L. DeLoach was published in 2000. The Third edition explores issues, advances, and contributions in Black Librarianship over the past twenty-two years.

The co-editors of this edition are Andrew 'Sekou' Jackson, co-editor of the award winning *The 21st Century Black Librarian in America: Issues and Challenges*; Marva L. DeLoach; and Michele Fenton, who recently co-authored, "*Leading While Black: Are We Up for the Challenge?*", which appears in *The Black Librarian in America: Reflections, Resistance, and Reawakening*.
