Over four years, the HBCU Digital Library Trust will implement initiative goals with trust and integrity, in concert with and in the best interest of each contributing institution. We will significantly increase digitization of archival resources documenting the history and culture of Historically Black Colleges and Universities through creation and utilization of HBCU digitization hubs. Further, the HBCU Digital Library Trust will expand the existing HBCU Digital Collection for broadened discoverability and access.

Expenses for digitization and approved shipping and supplies are covered by the Trust.
